- Dollars for College [N1361]: Enables kids to grow up with a college savings account, substantially increasing their likelihood of attending college and graduating.

- Family Connects [N1444]: A nurse home visiting program for postpartum caregivers that focuses on maternal and infant health and wellbeing.
- North Texas Summer and Supper Council [DALSUM]: Supports community organizations that provide nutritious meals to children during the summer months.

HOUSING

Homelessness Prevention [N1402]:
 Encourages housing stability through a continuum of services, including eviction prevention, rental assistance and support for affordable housing.

 Social Innovation [856]: A suite of programs that support local social entrepreneurs who are implementing creative solutions to challenges in education, income and health.
